FILM RECOMMENDATIONS:

Let's get the popcorn out!

1. On the Basis of Sex (2018)

- Directed by Mimi Leder

- A powerful portrayal of the early life and career of Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, highlighting her landmark case on sex discrimination.

2. Suffragette (2015)

- Directed by Sarah Gavron

- Set in 1912, this film follows working women in the UK who fought for women's suffrage, shedding light on their sacrifices and dedication to the cause.

3. Hidden Figures (2016)

- Directed by Theodore Melfi

- Based on real events, this film tells the story of three Black women who played crucial roles at NASA during the Space Race, breaking barriers of both gender and race.

4. Made in Dagenham (2010)

> As we celebrate these accomplished female musicians, let us reflect on the power of their voices, the messages in their lyrics, and the societal changes they've inspired.





METAPHOR: PAVED THE WAY

MEANING:

THE METAPHOR **"PAVED THE WAY"** IS A POWERFUL EXPRESSION THAT SIGNIFIES CLEARING OBSTACLES, CREATING OPPORTUNITIES, AND MAKING PROGRESS FOR OTHERS TO FOLLOW. IT IMPLIES THAT SOMEONE'S ACTIONS, ACHIEVEMENTS, OR CONTRIBUTIONS HAVE OPENED THE DOOR FOR OTHERS, BREAKING NEW GROUND AND MAKING FUTURE SUCCESS POSSIBLE.

EXAMPLE:

IN THE WORLD OF STEM, KATHERIN JOHNSON'S GROUNDBREAKING CONTRIBUTIONS AT NASA PAVED THE WAY FOR MORE WOMEN AND PEOPLE OF COLOR TO PURSUE CAREERS IN SPACE EXPLORATION AND RELATED FIELDS. HER DEDICATION AND BRILLIANCE NOT ONLY PROPELLED HER OWN CAREER BUT CREATED A FOUNDATION THAT ALLOWED OTHERS TO FOLLOW IN HER FOOTSTEPS. JOHNSON'S WORK SERVED AS A CATALYST, DEMOLISHING BARRIERS AND INSPIRING A NEW GENERATION TO REACH FOR THE STARS. SHE NOT ONLY CALCULATED TRAJECTORIES; SHE CHARTED A COURSE FOR INCLUSIVITY AND DIVERSITY IN SCIENTIFIC ENDEAVORS. **#**
